Season Series: The Desperados and Soul have met three previous times, with Dallas holding a 2-1 advantage.

Series Notables:

- * These teams became division rivals last season as Dallas moved into the Eastern Division and Philadelphia celebrated their inaugural season in the Eastern Division.
- * The first meeting between the two teams (2/15/04 - in Dallas) was decided by just four points, with the game-winning score coming with 0:34 remaining when Will Pettis hauled in a 19-yard touchdown pass.
- * Dallas posted their highest margin of victory (29 and scored their fourth highest point total in team history (72) in the first meeting this season.

HEAD COACHES

Will McClay (13-17-1 - 2nd Year)

Will McClay is in his second year as the Desperados Head Coach. He was promoted to lead the team three days before kicking off the 2004 AFL season following the resignation of Joe Avezzano. He also serves as the team's defensive coordinator, a position he has held since the teams inaugural season in 2002. In the AFL offseason, McClay works in the Dallas Cowboys Player Personnel Department. Prior to moving to Dallas, he was the Assistant Director of Pro Scouting with the Jacksonville Jaguars (2001) and Player Personnel Director of the XFL's Orlando Rage (2001). He was the Grand Rapids Rampage Defensive Coordinator/Director of Player Personnel (1998-99) after serving in the same capacity for the Anaheim Piranhas (1997). He served as the Defensive Coordinator for the Florida Bobcats (1996) and the Milwaukee Mustangs (1995) after beginning his coaching career with the Detroit Drive (1993). He was a WR/DB with Detroit from 1989-92, helping them win three ArenaBowl championships.

James Fuller (4-6, 1st Year)

James Fuller was named the Soul's second head coach in team history on March 1, 2005 after Michael Trigg was relieved of his duties. Fuller served as the Soul's defensive coordinator prior to the promotion. Fuller joined the Soul in 2005 after a stint as the head coach of the Bakersfield Blitz of af2. Fuller quickly established himself as one of the top coaches in arena football as he led the Oklahoma Wranglers to the top league ranking in total defense and pass defense in 2000 as the associate head coach and defensive coordinator. Prior to joining the Wranglers in 2000, Fuller spent two years as an assistant defensive coach for the Portland Forest Dragons of the AFL, where he played in 1998. He was originally drafted by the San Diego Chargers in the eighth round of the 1992 draft and went on to play for the New Orleans Saints and Philadelphia Eagles before a knee injury ended his NFL career.

Game Notes

LAST WEEK

The Dallas Desperados lost their third consecutive game, falling to the Georgia Force 56-63 in front of 14,011 fans at the Phillips Arena.

Dallas took possession to open the game and took 3:07 to drive 35 yards to open the scoring when Clint Stoerner hit Will Pettis in the end zone for a 10-yard touchdown. The Force answered with a 10-play, 6:54 drive culminating with a Matt Nagy-to-Derek Lee five-yard touchdown toss.

Dallas got back on top early in the second quarter when Stoerner found an open Jason Shelley with a seven-yard scoring pass. The Force knotted the game at 14-14 three plays later when Nagy hit Chris Jackson for a two-yard touchdown play. Dallas responded three plays later as Stoerner hooked up with Colston Weatherington on a 17-yard tight end screen for a touchdown. Georgia then took just two plays to tie the game as Nagy hit Lee once again - this time from 15 yards. The Desperados jumped back on top after a 10-play drive with a Stoerner-to-Bobby Sippio two-yard scoring pass. Georgia pulled within one as Nagy hit Troy Bergeron on a 14-yard touchdown pass (PAT failed). Dallas's attempt to extend their lead before half failed as they were forced into a Carlos Martinez 53-yard field goal attempt that missed as time expired in the half.

Georgia opened the second half with a four-play drive culminating with a 22-yard Jackson scoring catch from Nagy. Dallas answered and jumped to a 35-34 lead as Duke Pettijohn took a toss from Stoerner and sprinted 25 yards for the score. The Force regained the lead as Nagy and Jackson hooked up for a 12-yard touchdown toss. The Dallas offense stalled on the ensuing possession, and failed to put points on the board after Martinez's 61-yard field goal attempt hit the upright. Bergeron returned the miss 11 yards to the Georgia 15-yard line. The Force upped their lead to 48-35 at the end of the third frame when Matt Carey caught a four-yard Nagy touchdown pass.

Dallas opened fourth period scoring when Will Pettis scampered in from one-yard out. Jermaine Jones gave Dallas the swing when he picked off Nagy's pass at the Georgia 22-yard line and ran it in for the score, giving Dallas a 49-48 advantage. Georgia wasted no time in regaining the lead as Jackson caught his fourth touchdown of the game from Nagy - a 22-yarder. On the ensuing kickoff, Sippio took the ball off the net and sprinted 56 yards for the score, giving Dallas a 56-55 lead. Three plays later, Georgia jumped back on top 63-56 with a 20-yard Nagy-to-Jackson scoring pass (two-point attempt converted). Dallas took over with 3:04 remaining in the contest but were forced into a turnover on downs. Georgia was then able to run out the clock.

PHILADELPHIA LAST WEEK

The Philadelphia Soul were defeated by the Columbus Destroyers in their last home game of the season in front of a crowd of 17,092 at the Wachovia Center.

Columbus put the first points on the board with a seven-yard touchdown pass from Matt D'Orazio to Jeremy Unertl. Philadelphia wasted no time in evening the score with a two-yard run from Chris Ryan, tying the game at 7-7. D'Orazio's one-yard touchdown run put the Destroyers back up by a score late in the first quarter.

Tony Graziani completed a 13-yard touchdown pass to Steve Smith as well as a 45-yard score to Marcus Knight. Ryan who ran for three touchdowns, rumbled for a 17-yard score with 6:44 left in the second quarter. D'Orazio answered with two touchdown passes, the first a 26-yard pass to Damien Groce, and a 36-yard pass to Cornelius White with 55 seconds left in the quarter bringing the score to 28-28.

The kickers determined the final score of the quarter with the Soul's Tim Seder converting a 23-yard field goal, matched by Steve Videtich's 28-yard field goal for a 31-31 score at half-time.

The third quarter started slowly with each team scoring only once. The Soul got a one-yard touchdown run from Ryan, while D'Orazio completed a 33-yard touchdown pass to Bobby Olive.

The fourth quarter started with the Destroyers in possession of the ball and D'Orazio completing a four-yard pass to White, six seconds into the frame, to take a 45-38 lead. The Soul answered the touchdown with a 16-yard pass from Graziani-to-Smith. White then blew past the Soul defense - to a chorus of "boos" from the crowd - scoring again on a 13-yard pass from D'Orazio. The Soul regained control with a nine-yard pass completion to Smith, evening the score at 52-52 with 48 seconds remaining. Unfortunately, the score would not be enough to keep the Soul spirit alive, as Videtich converted a 20-yard field goal to win the game 55-52.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

This week's season finale against the Philadelphia Soul is also Dallas's final division game of the 2005 season. The Desperados were defeated in their first division game of 2005 at New York (55-65) but notched wins in the next three: against Columbus (35-31), at Philadelphia (72-43) and at Columbus (55-33) before losing to the Dragons at home (57-65).

ONE...TWO MORE FOR THE RECORDS

In his bid for Rookie of the Year honors, Desperados signal caller Clint Stoerner has strung together a record-breaking rookie performance. In the last two games, Stoerner has set league season records for touch-down passes by a rookie quarterback (71 currently) and completions by a rookie quarterback (304 currently). With one game remaining, Stoerner needs just two pass attempts (484 currently) and 100 passing yards (3,688 currently) to break two more records. PILE 'EM UP

Ironman of the Year candidate **Will Pettis** has continued to show why he deserves the honor. Despite playing just more than two full games at defensive specialist, Pettis is ranked **23rd** in the league in receiving yards. He is **leading** the league in **kickoff return yards** (1,460), **tied for the league lead** in **kickoff returns for touchdowns** (four) and ranks **second** in the league in all-purpose yards (2,530). He is **tops** in the league in **combined returns** and **combined return yards**. In addition, he is tied for the team lead (tied for 10th in the league) with **five** interceptions. Pettis needs just 29 receiving yards for his second consecutive 1,000-yard season. Here is a look at how Pettis compares to other league Ironman candidates:
